

# JUNIOR EUNETHYDIS CALL FOR PAPERS

## Junior Eunethydis ADHD Conference

will be held on **Tuesday 25th May, 13:00 - 17:30** and **Wednesday 26th May, 08:30 - 12:00** at Agorazaal I, Main Building Vrije Universiteit, De Boelelaan, Amsterdam, The Netherlands

The chairperson will be Dr Argyris Stringaris.

At this meeting presentations of ongoing work by Junior Faculty, Ph.D. students and post-docs will be presented.

This call for papers can be on any topic of scientific and clinical interest in the area. However, proposals in three areas of current interest are particularly encouraged:

**Emotional problems in ADHD: Merely a consequence?**

**All confounded? Therapeutic effects in ADHD research.**

**Reward how much does it explain for ADHD?**

Other topics can be proposed, including a complete session with speakers (*maximum 3*).

The chosen lectures for the Junior Eunethydis will also be used by the Scientific Programme Committee to assess candidates for three prizes to be presented at the main conference. **Two prizes will be for Ph.D. student and post-doc submissions.** The category of early career scientists/clinicians will include those under the age of 40 who do not hold a position as chair. **A third prize will be given for the best published paper in ADHD by any of these categories.** The prize for Ph.D. students and post-docs will be sponsorship to attend an international ADHD conference of your choice, in the following 12 month period, to include travel and accommodation. For the early career scientistis/clinicians there is a prize of €5,000.00.

Abstracts (max 180 words) for submission should have the following format:
