

SEXUAL MINORITY RESEARCH IN THE NEW MILLENNIUM

We are looking for contributors to an edited book tentatively titled, "Sexual minority research in the new millennium," which is scheduled for publication by Nova Science in late 2010.

It should be noted that the term "sexual minority" is being applied broadly and includes gay, lesbian, bisexual, queer, and asexual persons. Submissions from various disciplines (e.g., psychology, sociology, media studies, gender studies, etc.) are welcome as are manuscripts that employ quantitative and/or qualitative methods. Potential topics include: media representations of sexual minorities; prejudice, discrimination, and stereotyping; intimacy; parenthood; contestations of "legitimacy" vis-à-vis asexuality and bisexuality; the phenomenology of difference; communities and activism; changing identities; etc. If you have any queries about the suitability of a given topic, please contact one of the editors listed below.

Manuscripts should range from 20 to 40 typed double-spaced pages excluding references, tables, and appendices, and should be prepared in accordance with the American Psychological Association's (5th edition) style guidelines. Manuscripts should use 12-point Times Roman font, with pages numbered. **THE DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSIONS IS DECEMBER 1, 2009.**

All submissions will be subject to blind review by at least two of the editors and one or more external reviewers. To facilitate blind review, identifying details should be provided in the email accompanying electronic submission of the document. No authorial or institutional information should appear on the title page of the manuscript or body of the paper. Upon receipt, the manuscript will undergo peer review, with a decision issued in approximately 6 to 8 weeks.

Manuscripts should be sent electronically as Word or PDF attachments to Dr. Todd G. Morrison (email: todd.morrison@usask.ca).
